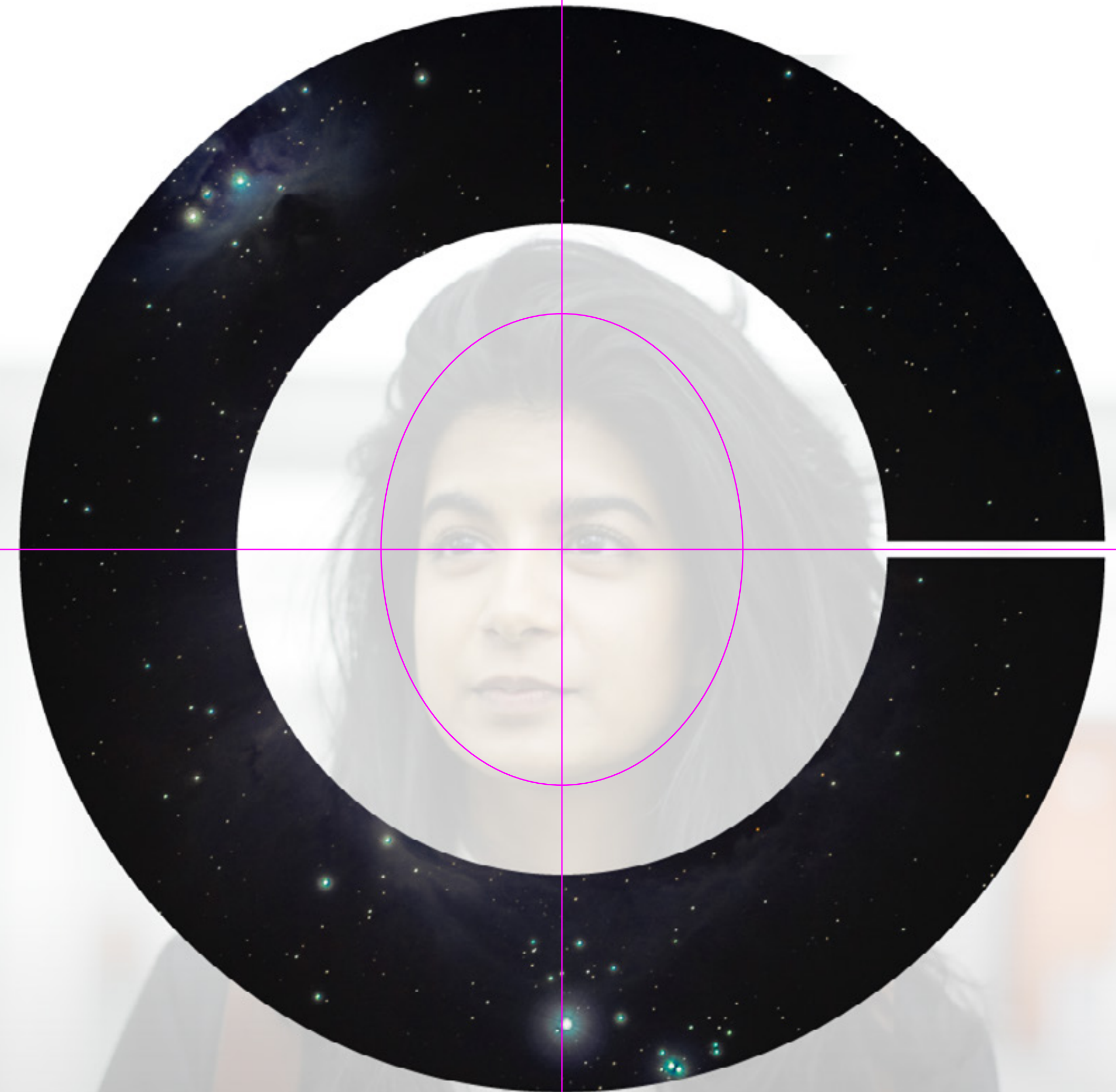
The primary design element in the Creation Sabbath is the C, which is used to help focus on a particular piece of God's creation.

The way the C is designed, the best images are ones where faces are vertically and horizontally centered, and somewhat small relative to the size of the complete image.

Here you can see what the image used in the example looked like before adding the C.

If you don't have an image that matches the centered placement, don't worry! We can try to work with slightly different placements, as long as the size of the face is small enough and has enough space around it. Here, for example, the face is centered horizontally, but not vertically. It's not ideal, but it still works!

Here's an example using a portrait on a solid color background. Because of the solid color, it works okay, but it's a bit trickier to use. If you can, try to take or find a photo where you are in an interesting natural environment with enough space around your face so that the whole image can fill the graphic.
